**6 grammar: the verb "be"**

Use **am/is/are** to say who you are, where you are from, and what you do.

am / is / are

The verb **be** has three forms: **am**, **is**, and **are**. We use it to introduce ourselves and other people.

Subject	Form	Short form	Example
I	am	I'm	<i>I am Ali. → I'm Ali.</i>
You	are	You're	<i>You are my teacher.</i>
He	is	He's	<i>He is from Pakistan. → He's from Pakistan.</i>
She	is	She's	<i>She is a nurse. → She's a nurse.</i>
We	are	We're	<i>We are students.</i>
They	are	They're	<i>They are from Poland.</i>

① **From the video:** "My **name's** Tim" = "My name **is** Tim." The '**s**' is the short form of **is**!

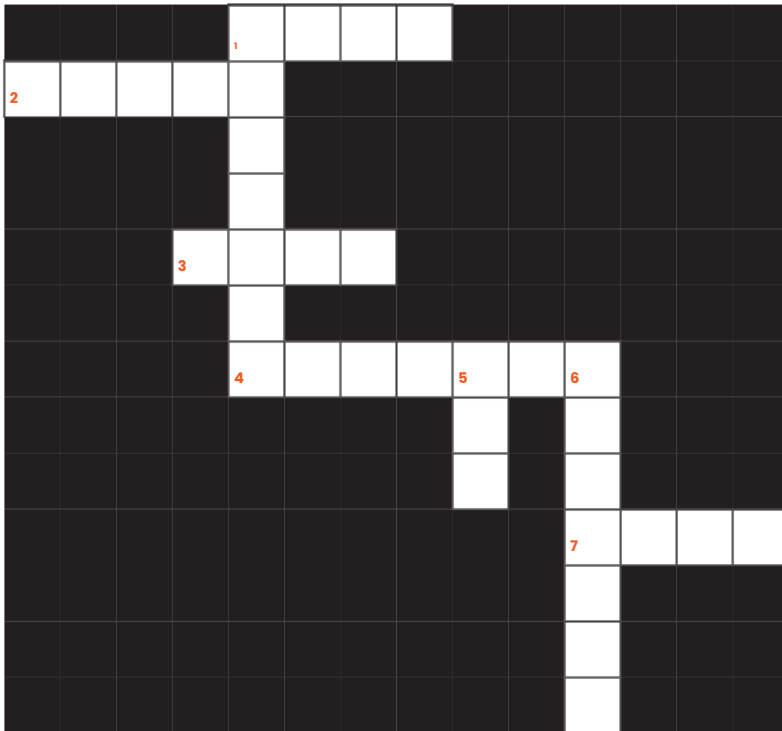
